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The Property Ombudsman APPROVED

If your property is already on the market with another agent, then the terms and conditions of those instructions must be considered in order to avoid liability of two commissions.

The Labour Government released a Devolution White Paper that revealed a plan to forge ahead with wholesale changes to the landscape of Local Government in England. Over the next five years devolution will be extended to 85% of England's population.

One question for prospective mayoral candidates to answer is "will you be introducing a mayoral precept to add to Council Tax?". Rob Waltham has already answered that question with a definite no.

Review of Polling Districts and Polling Places

NELC have been required to review polling districts and polling places. The working party recommendations were approved at a Full NELC meeting. A response to the recommendations from the Local Government Boundary Commission for England is anticipated, and at that time the arrangement for NELC, Local Government, and more importantly for residents of Humberston and New Waltham, may become clearer. The White Paper previously referenced, announces "that we will facilitate a programme of local government reorganisation".

Housing

NELC has received a new National Planning Policy Framework document from Central Government. The council's housing target is currently 469, falling to 190 new homes. However, the new government target for NELC is 623 new homes a year. Residents of Humberston and New Waltham will be fully aware of the outcomes at appeal, for a council that cannot demonstrate capacity for a five year housing supply.

Happy New Year.

We are approaching a period of profound change for Local Government.

Devolution

On Thursday, 1st May 2025 we will be asked to vote to select a directly elected mayor for the newly created Greater Lincolnshire Mayoral Combined County Authority (MCCA). This historic deal marks a new devolution agreement between government and the local authorities of Lincolnshire County Council, North East Lincolnshire, and North Lincolnshire.

The deal transfers new powers and funding to the Greater Lincolnshire MCCA, alongside a £720 million long-term investment fund to drive economic growth and take forward local priorities. Alongside this, the deal includes £8.6 million of investment in brownfield funding, devolution of the Adult Education Budget, and £20 million of capital funding in advance of the inaugural election to drive place-based economic regeneration in Greater Lincolnshire (subject to business cases).

Confirmed candidates for the mayoral election are Rob Waltham (Conservative), Andrea Jenkins (Reform UK) and Jason Stockwood (Labour Party). It is to be anticipated that there will be more candidates to declare.

The NELC website does have numerous articles under the heading of 'Greater Lincolnshire Devolution' for residents to read. Ward councillors are happy to field questions, but I am sure there will be plenty of literature distributed and opportunities to engage with the candidates.

Highways/Footpaths/Traffic Issues

The Village Council had its quarterly meeting with NELC Highways in early February and various schemes were discussed. Quite a few roads are being surfaced dressed in Spring/Summer 2025.

Planning

The Village Council continues to receive consultation on many planning applications for Humberston and these are discussed at the Village Council main monthly meetings and also at an interim Planning Committee Meeting held mid-way through the month.

Residents are most welcome to attend and make the Village Council aware of any issues with planning. All Planning Agendas and Minutes are all on the Village Council website. The minutes show the Village Council's observations and comments on each

application it considered.

Wendover Paddock and Halls

The Village Halls continue to be very busy with lots of regular hirings and lots of private hirings at weekends.

There is a variety of regular classes/groups using the Halls.

We now have had our solar panels installed and they are up and running and hopefully will offset a considerable amount of our electricity costs for both the halls in the Paddock area.

Finance

The Council met in January 2025 and set its budget and precept requirement for the Village of Humberston for the fy 25/26 and the budget is shown in this edition of the Newsletter.

Crime

Greetings from St Peter's Church.

Ideas and proposals will be considered and then decision made on what can be purchased and sited within the area.

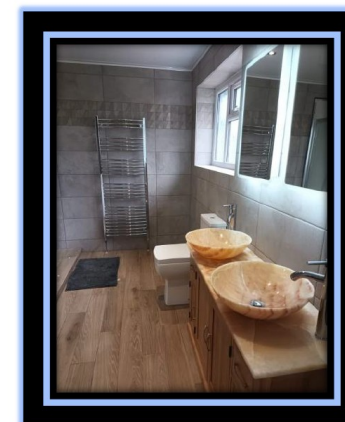
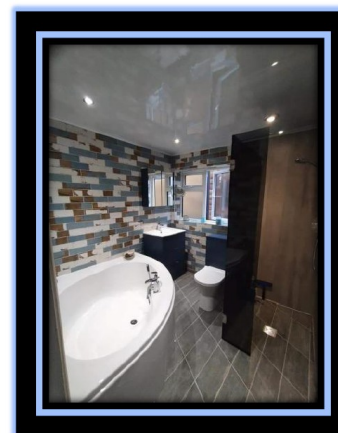

HUMBERSTON BUDGET AND PRECEPT FOR FY 25-26

The Village Council met in January 2025 and set its budget for the coming financial year of 25/26 and also the precept requirement for the Village which has now been requested from NELC.

Budget for 25/26 is as follows:-

Administration **£8,260**

This includes office expenses, insurance, membership of local council organisations, training, audit fees, website and IT support and hosting.

Staffing **£65,000**

This covers all 6 staff positions, employer's liability insurance cover, pension contributions and all PAYE expenses. Salary levels are not set by the Council but follow national pay scales.

Village Hall Expenses **£12,150**

This includes all energy costs for gas and electricity, water rates, insurance for building and contents, all cleaning materials and consumables, decoration and maintenance, internet provision and any necessary checks and licences for items such as fire fighting equipment and music licences.

Wendover Paddock **£11,000**

Covers required annual inspection of all playground equipment and any necessary repairs and maintenance and a £10k project for this coming year for new equipment for the paddock area.

Elections on 1st May 2025

Elections will be held on 1st May 2025 for an Elected Mayor following devolution. Residents will be asked to vote for a Mayor for the newly created Greater Lincolnshire Mayoral Combined County Authority (MCCA).

Wendover Queen Elizabeth Hall will be one of the polling stations for use by residents as usual on that day.



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Cemetery Expenses

£43,100

This covers all maintenance contracts for the cemetery, water rates, provision of waste facility, loan repayments for the new cemetery extension project, turfing and necessary repairs and maintenance. The contract for the cemetery maintenance is up for renewal this year and will be decided by the Council at a meeting in the Spring and then awarded as appropriate.

Allotment Expense

£2,720

This covers the site rent from NELC, the annual competition, projects to be agreed and any necessary repairs and maintenance.

Newsletter

£9,000

This includes the printing in full colour of the Newsletter—four editions each year—and the distribution which is carried out by local youngsters sub-contracted by the Village Council.

Events

£4,500

Included in this is the Summer Event, the Christmas Event, holiday clubs in the Summer and some seniors' lunches.

Other/Projects

£30,250

This category has projects and maintenance included such as maintaining the Centenary Green, tree work within the Cemetery site, reserves for tarmac repairs and a sum to go into the land management fund which covers land which the Village Council owns and has to maintain.

Revenue streams

The Village Council generates revenue from various sources—these being the hire of both Wendover Hall and the Queen Elizabeth Hall, the Cemetery, the Allotments, some events and Newsletter advertising.

Revenue is variable depending on usage of Halls and Cemetery but averages approximately £34,000 for the Halls (combined), £20,000 for the cemetery, £4,000 for the allotments and approximately £2,000 from Newsletter advertising and approx. £500 from events, although some smaller events are self financing and others are provided free of charge to local residents with the Village Council covering the costs.

Precept Setting

The Village Council has set the precept for fy 25/26 at £125,000.00 for Humberston Village. Approximate breakdown per house banding is shown below. Costs for the year per house.

HUMBERSTON LIONS CLUB

We have had another great Christmas time raising over £9,300 thanks to the generosity of the residents on North East Lincs. Our Santa Sleigh had 6 outings to the major supermarkets in the lead up to Christmas raising a magnificent £3,338 and our Christmas Grand Charity Draw raised an amazing £6,300 with major prizes of a “Barrow of Booze” and a cash prize of £500. There were in excess of 50 prizes in total valued at over £2,500, all kindly donated by individuals and local firms. We are amazed and greatly thankful to all for the sponsorship and the gifts we received and, of course, the generosity of our community for buying the raffle tickets.

This big sum allowed us to make donations of £7,400 to many worthy causes in the run up to Christmas such as £2330 – Food Hampers and Vouchers for needy families, £1000 – Home Alone at Xmas to provide support and comfort for those who are on their own, £2000 – Grimsby Food Kitchen to provide food for the homeless in the town over Christmas, £880 – Harbour Place supplying gloves, hats, scarves and sleeping bags for distribution among the town’s homeless, and £450 for Christmas parties at 2 Primary Schools in needy areas of Grimsby. There were other donations to some who cannot be identified for privacy reasons.

On a totally different tack, unfortunately our Club Facebook page was shut down by Facebook’s parent company, META, as they would not allow us to use the Lions logo on our site as they saw it as a fraudulent copy of the Lions International logo that the head office in the USA use. This problem affected quite a number of Lions Clubs and so an agreement has now been reached with META but they would not re-instate any of the pages that we have accumulated over the years showing what we have done. As this is our major means of advertising our fund raising activities, the loss of all of our past is very disappointing to say the least. But we soldier on.

CEMETERY NEWS

The new additional cemetery extension is now almost complete. The gazebo structure is finished and there are benches installed beneath it to provide somewhere to sit quietly for visitors.

The Village Council members are now considering what type of memorial structure to have to house memorial plaques which will be available for anyone to purchase and more details of that will follow in the next Newsletter.

The hedging is also being sourced which will be planted around the edge of the stock fencing currently on site.

The Village Council will be awarding the Cemetery Maintenance Contract this Spring as it is up for renewal from July 2025 and various quotations have been received by the Chairman.

Purchasing a Burial or Ashes Plot in Humberston Cemetery
