



Close to home to our place, North east Lincolnshire, as cabinet members we have worked hard on formulating and now delivering the multitude of developments taking place now and over the next two years. To remind you of the major works, evidence of which will soon be apparent as demolition has starts:- In Grimsby we will see the redevelopment of Grimsby Town Centre with a new Multi -screen Cinema to be operated by Parkway cinemas, new Market Hall, restaurants and the Community Diagnostic Centre which has just opened. This will transform and modernise the centre, shifting its focus form purely retail to entertainment and community support.

St James House reopening as a new centre for business development and support.

Horizon Youth Zone opening this summer.

New housing development on Alexander Dock including social housing

Beginning work on new transport hub in Bethlehem Street,

In Cleethorpes we will start the modernisation of Peir Gardens, a new iconic building on Sea Road, and the redevelopment of the Market Place. This follows he creation of the Cleethorpes Masterplan following extensive public consultation (over 6000 responses). Finally following a much-protracted period of renovation, we should see Corporation Road Bridge reopen in the late summer. This listed heritage structure required significantly more restoration than was originally anticipated, but work should be coming to an end shortly.

Ward Councillor Notes

Wow. I can't believe I am already writing summer notes for 2025. Where has the year gone. Anyway, here we are.

Given recent events, I thought it might be a good time to reflect on what your ward councillors do, and bring you up to date on developments in the wider North East Lincolnshire area.

To remind you, there are three elected councillors for Humberston and New Waltham, these are Cllr Stephen Harness, Cllr Hayden Dawkins and myself Cllr Stan Shreeve all of whom are Conservatives. Between us we deal with many ward related issues, current amongst which are nuisance parking, planning matters, the perennial issues of potholes, bin collections, parking restrictions, liaison with the police and sadly a small number of neighbour disputes amongst the many things. In fact, whilst many would argue that our ward is fairly quiet but just checking my own log I can see that I have dealt with over 40 matters since covid, and that just the ones that I have recorded. Many issues are dealt with by a simple phone call and not posted on my log. I'm sure my colleagues can match or exceed this. I would also remind residents that we attend both Parish council meetings monthly and pick up issues at these meetings on a regular basis. We all know the ward very well and walk it regularly.

As I move onto the wider North East Lincolnshire area, it is worth reminding you that all of your ward councillors are cabinet members as well as ward councillors. I am Deputy Leader of the council, and have Health, Wellbeing and Adult Social Care portfolio. Cllr Harness is portfolio holder for Finance, Resources and Assets and Cllr Dawkins portfolio holder for Culture, Heritage and the Visitor Economy.

Probably the first thing to mention is that following a considerable amount of work and lobbying Central Government, the Mayoral Authority of Greater Lincolnshire has now come into being. The Mayoral Authority comprises three unitary councils of North East Lincolnshire (Grimsby, Cleethorpes, Immingham and rural surroundings), North Lincolnshire (Scunthorpe, Brigg, Barton and surrounds) and Lincolnshire County (Lincon, Louth, Boston, Stamford and large rural areas) The Mayoral authority deals with liaison with Central Government, providing a voice and channelling funding directly from government to the constituent parts of the Mayoral Authority.



Humberston & New Waltham Ward Update May 2025

Crime

There were fifty eight reported crimes across the Humberston & New Waltham Ward for April. For Humberston these included:

Burglary:

Overnight 11th & 12th April, two suspects approach a storage shed at the rear of a caravan on Thorpe Park. They forced entry to the shed and stole two bikes. They rode off, leaving behind a bike that they had arrived on.

During the early hours of 17th April, a caravan on Thorpe Park was broken into by four persons. Damage was caused inside. One youth has so far been arrested in relation to this offence.

Criminal Damage:

On 11th April two cars were set alight on land at Tetney Road. A window was damaged at The Countryman pub after three males were asked to leave. As they left, one of them threw the brick through the window.

One domestic related criminal damage.

Other crime include:

Nine assaults.

Eight reports of harassment.

Eight minor public order incidents.

There were two reports of ASB, both in relation to a long running neighbour dispute.

Please note the closing times for the Car Park and do not park on verges, or block the road for emergency vehicles.

Fitties News

Which one of these designations applies to the area in and around The Humberston Fitties Plotland: SSSI (Site of Special Scientific Interest), RAMSAR, Nature Reserve, Conservation Area, King Charles IIII England Coast Path? The answer is all of them! The Saltmarsh at the end of Fitties Beach is an important Summer habitat for ground nesting birds such as Redshank and in Winter visitors such as Plover, Brent Geese and Sanderling are often seen. Raptors including the Hen Harrier, Kestrel and Buzzard are also frequently sighted. In recent years swifts and swallows have returned to swoop over the 'no mow' zone close to the RSPB Car Park. The salty Lagoon is a micro habitat in itself and boasts a specially adapted rare variety of shrimp. We also have a population of Pipistrelle bats which can be seen at dusk throughout the Summer months.

How privileged we are to have such a gem on our doorstep! You would think that such an important area for wildlife should be revered and respected. Whilst most visitors are careful to 'leave only footprints' there are some who are not so conscientious. Many of us enjoy the dog friendly area of Fitties Beach, but recently we have noticed a significant increase of littering and dog fouling both on the beach and within the reserve. In addition, we are experiencing an increased disregard for the PSPO (public space protection order) which amongst other things forbids fires, barbecues, sky lanterns and fireworks. Members of Humberston Fitties Neighbourhood Watch and Pickwalks conduct regular litter

THE HUMBERSTON FITTIES COMPANY LIMITED

Do you have any information about the Humberston Fitties Company?

Three local historians are exploring the history of a narrow-gauge railway that ran from the Humberston Wadhouse, at the bottom of South Sea Lane, to a sand and gravel pit lying directly to the south during the 1920s and 1930s. The railway was run and the quarry was managed by the Humberston Fitties Company. The company was trading in the 1920s and 1930s and the small steam locomotive and railway servicing the quarry was active until about 1942, when the engine was reportedly broken up on site. The Company also owned other land in the Fitties which was sold to Grimsby Rural District Council in 1938.

If you have any information about the company or the narrow gauge railway, or if you have any old photos of the steam engine or the track or the buildings on site, could you please contact Martin Watkinson (martinwatkinson@btinternet.com) in the first instance. He will be very pleased to hear from you.


