Ward Councillor Notes

Hello everybody and thank you for taking the time to read the councillors notes.

It's been awhile since I've done the notes and I thought I'd be a bit different. I think it's true to say at the moment the country is going through transformation which is not going particularly well.

I understand that a year and a half ago everybody wanted change, but I don't think anybody wanted to change that we received unfortunately. Locally a lot of things have happened, housing developments that have gone bust and housing developments built in places that ideally we didn't all want to see, and as ward councillors we did everything we could to try and make sure these didn't happen however the powers higher up thought differently.

It's worth noting that on the failed housing developments the council has very little powers to stop these developments starting and failing, and i call on all land owners to consider who they are selling land too to try and stop this happening again.

We used to have control of housing developments, and where people could build in line with the local plan, however since the new government came in they have increased our numbers of new properties from 200 odd to over 600 per year which I think is ridiculous, This has put us in a situation where housing developments may well pop up in many more places that we don't want to see, we will obviously do whatever we can to stop these but again central government will overrule us.

So that's the negative stuff out the way, there is a lot happening in North-east Lincolnshire and in particular Cleethorpes, this is about to start a transformation that we've never seen before and it'll bring Cleethorpes into the 21st century. I cannot personally wait for the redevelopments to happen as I have been working on it for quite a long time, and are looking forward to seeing the spades in the ground .

I apologise in advance if there's any disruption that may impact you or any of your family but we need to get on with these developments and they're all going to be starting around the same time.

There were forty-five reported crimes across the Humberston & New Waltham Wards for October 2025.

On 31st October 2025 a windscreen to a motor vehicle was damaged by unknown persons on ALBERRY WAY, NEW WALTHAM.

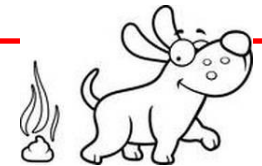
BAG IT AND BIN IT !!

HUMBERSTON FITTIES NEWS

Taking care of the Fitties beach and SSSI

Our Fitties beach is a special place, and if you've been coming across any problems, such as dog waste or litter, then Rachel Graham, from NELC's ecology department, has given this advice. She's also raised an issue with garden waste being fly-tipped. There will be some events planned for the next few months to help clear away some of this material, as it causes problems for the SSSI habitat.

"Fires and not picking up after your dog are regulated under our PSPO and enforced by the PSPO officers. As we only have a certain amount of officers, if areas are highlighted as undergoing particular problems, they can be noted as a hotspot and efforts by the officers will be focused in that area. Evidence is required of the issues so it needs to be reported to us through our 'Report It' page [Report it | NELC](#), the more reports received will identify areas as requiring attention.

"Enforcement is one way to deal with things on the spot, but we also have a programme of communications where consistent messaging is issued as behaviour change through awareness raising is the most effective and long-term solution. The DUNE project is also a feature of that.

"We do have an issue with garden waste being dumped within the SSSI and garden escapees are now growing and piles of decaying vegetation will add unwanted nutrients, lowering the condition of the SSSI habitat, both of which is a management issue for us. It is also fly-tipping. It would be helpful if this message could be passed on to help prevent it from happening."

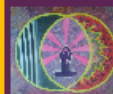
