Cemetery maintenance has continued as usual throughout the lockdown period.

## Humberston Parish Council - Parish Council Notes

The last meetings of the Parish Council have been held virtually via the Zoom platform, with members accessing the meeting with both audio and visual means. Members of the public have also been joining in as well as Ward Councillors. The meetings will hopefully be held normally when appropriate to do so, but in the meantime the meeting schedule has been maintained throughout the last 5 months to maintain the business of the Council.

### New Member

A new member, Cllr. Mark Thompson, was coopted at the meeting in August. As of the end of August, 11 members sit on the Council and there is still 1 casual vacancies.

### Highways/Footpaths/Traffic Issues

The TRO for Humberston which will prevent parking on verges and footways is now a legally active Order. Enforcement will not take place until all legal signing is in place, which is anticipated to be during September 2020. Once signing is up, enforcement officers will follow a 14 day 'warning period', issuing warning tickets only, after that proper enforcement will take place. The Parish Council will advise the active date for enforcement on social media etc. when it is aware of when it is.

### Wendover Hall and Wendover Paddock Hall

The Halls are now open again and some of the regular hirers have returned, with more due back in September. Parties are still not allowed at the time of going to press. The buildings are Covid-19 secure with all necessary precautions put in place and all hiring groups aware of necessary measures etc.

### Planning

The Parish Council continues to receive consultation on many planning applications for Humberston and these are discussed at the Parish Council main monthly meetings and also at an interim Planning Committee Meeting held mid-way through the month.

Residents are most welcome to attend and make the Parish Council aware of any issues with planning. All Planning Agendas and Minutes are all on the Parish Council website. /continued over.....

The Parish Council has submitted all necessary paperwork to the external auditors and there are copies of all of this on the PC website under Finance.

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## Local Community News

### Humberston & New Waltham Ward Update August 2020

#### Crime

There have been 43 reported crimes across the Humberston & New Waltham Ward for July. There were 24 reports for Humberston.

#### Commercial Burglary: 4

During the evening of 3<sup>rd</sup> July entry was made into the unoccupied McCormack's Bar. It is unknown if anything was stolen.

About 1am on 8<sup>th</sup> July Lucarly's pub on Wilton Road was entered via the roof. Alcohol was stolen.

During the early hours of 18<sup>th</sup> July an attempt was made to enter the Golden Bridge Takeaway on North Sea Lane by forcing the front door. No entry was made.

Around the same time, an attempt was made to enter the Ticker T Boo store by trying to force a window. Damage was caused but no entry made.

#### Vehicle Crime: 2

During the early hours of 14<sup>th</sup> July a person is caught on CCTV trying car doors on Lime Grove.

Sometime during the day on 20<sup>th</sup> July a horse riding saddle and boots were stolen from a car parked at a premises on Jackson Place.

#### Criminal Damage: 4

A fire was set in an outbuilding at a derelict property on Tetney Road. A resident has been charged with causing damage within a residential home on Humberston Avenue.



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## **Ward Councillor Notes**

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### **Ward Councillors notes – Summer 2020**

Six months ago the world was different, and then Corona virus came along and changed everything. We have had extended lockdown, restrictions on our personal movements and for many a significant and possibly irreversible way of working. Our ward has a high number of residents who were and are shielding. Your ward councillors and the Parishes have been involved in delivering food parcels and maintaining contact with vulnerable individuals, sometimes just for a chat. In some ways this whole crisis has brought out the best in us. In fact, as the Chair of Humberston Parish reported, we had more people volunteering to help than we had people needing help.

We are also fortunate in North East Lincolnshire to have amongst the lowest rate of infection nationally. One of the benefits of being a bit out on a limb we would guess.

The national and local response to the crisis is formidable, with billions of pounds deployed supporting the economy through the furlough scheme and other business support

Locally NEL has distributed over £35 million to local business in business rates rebates and other support, and the council has received over £11 million to help with Adult Social Care, hardship funding and meeting the significant costs incurred as a result of the virus.

We have seen a relaxation of restrictions in recent weeks, but we all have to wear face masks in shops and cinemas, and on public transport. Locally the economy is starting to pick up, with many more residents returning to work, and our resort of Cleethorpes seeing visitors return. This is a time of increased risk, and we all worry about a second wave. The best we can do is stick to the rules on social distancing, wash our hands regularly and do our best to continue to support our vulnerable neighbours.

On to our own locality, work has started on upgrading Tollbar roundabout (one of our key election pledges), and whilst there will be some disruption; it is being managed as well as it can be. The main contractor has appointed a liaison officer who is in touch with residents directly affected by the works. The work is scheduled to take some months to complete as each leg will be upgraded in rotation.

The Traffic Regulation Order for Humberston and New Waltham are close to being enacted. All exceptions are now agreed, and once signage has been delivered during the coming weeks, the TROs will be fully implemented.

There is a proposed speed restriction of 30 mph for Humberston Avenue which is out for consultation now. Many residents feel that this restriction is unnecessary for this long and straight road, but it's up to you to make your views known.

Finally, planning applications for the ward continue to come forward, some of which are controversial, South View for instance. If you want to have a say, keep an eye on the NEL planning portal and the Parish Council meeting agenda to see the latest applications.

## BEST EVER PAVLOVA

If you're thinking of putting on a dessert for a special occasion, or just want to enjoy all the lovely summer fruits etc. at this time of year, this recipe is fullproof

as long as you follow the instructions!

3 large egg whites

6 oz caster sugar

Cream and fruit to decorate as required



Preheat the oven to 150 C

Place the 3 egg whites in a large, clean bowl .

Whisk until you can tip the bowl over and the egg whites won't fall out—it is important though not to over-beat them, just gentle peaks which won't slip out of the bowl is all you're after that this stage.

Then add the caster sugar, 1 oz at a time, beating after addition to make sure its all been mixed in.

You should be left with a glossy meringue mix which maintains its peaks in the bowl.

Spoon out onto a baking tray lined with greaseproof paper/baking parchment and make a circle with 3/4 of the mix. Use the remaining 1/4 of the mixture to build up around the sides so that there is a dip in the middle for fruit etc. Use a fork to make nice peaks around the edge.

Bake in the oven at the temperature shown for approximately 1 hour. When done, turn off the oven and leave the Pavlova in there to completely dry out. If making the evening before, leave in overnight and take out in the morning. If making on the same day, make it early and then leave in the oven all day until required in the evening.

Whip the cream and mix with the fruit and put on top of the Pavlova and serve.

Ta-Dah!!!


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## **St.Peter's Parish Church, Humberston**

Greetings from St Peter's Church

Things are starting to change at last and life is getting a little bit back to normal. People cycling to work and taking bike rides together as a family and with friends. Walking short distances instead of popping in the car. This has been very good for family life and for our beautiful planet. Neighbours speaking to each other more because they have had more time. Some things in lockdown have been enjoyable. I think we have learnt to appreciate each other more. So don't let's rush back to totally normal too soon.

St Peter's Church is now open every Sunday between 11am and 12pm for private prayer only. The necessary restrictions are all in place and worshippers can at last get back into Church. Masks do need to be worn as per government instructions. Some may not feel confident to go out into the world yet but this will happen as time passes. If you are feeling anxious the Bible does offer words of comfort and one such passage is from Philippians 4:6

"Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God.

St Peter's is always keen to welcome people both in Church and to our Facebook page, where you can keep in touch with what is going on in the Church locally as well as the wider Church.

This year on 15<sup>th</sup> August, V.J day was commemorated in the Churchyard with a reading and 75 peals of the bells to mark the 75 years since this day. On this day Japan agreed to the Potsdam Declaration and on September second at last it was done and the World War was over. This date is not as well remembered as V.E day but in Singapore, Thailand and Burma our forgotten army still had to clear up the mess. " We mustn't forget the war in the Far East or the lives which were lost before the battles were ceased."

## **Land at Carrington Gardens/Westleigh Homes Site;**

Some residents may be aware that the Parish Council has recently taken ownership of the Public Open Spaces around the Carrington Gardens retirement village site and the Westleigh Homes site. The land has been transferred to the Parish Council, free of charge, so that the public open spaces can be managed and maintained locally. A 'commuted sum' of monies was also passed to the Parish Council to help maintain the land.

An initial clear-up operation has been undertaken on the site and a maintenance contract issued for a year whilst the Parish Council monitors the site for the first year.

New dog/waste bins have been provided along the length of the Public Right of Way and later there will be bulbs planted and a few more trees and shrubs etc.

It is important to note that the area is supposed to be a natural grass area and it will only be cut as a site once each year, usually during October. During the rest of the year, natural grasses are to be allowed to grow along with any wild flowers etc. Paths will be mown and maintained and trees and shrubs maintained so that the area can be enjoyed by walking through it, but the natural areas will be allowed to grow as per the Management Plan set by the Local Planning Authority when the site was granted its permission.

The final rear phase, when complete, will also see the public space being transferred into the ownership of the PARish Council
