Planning and Development Consultation

Ward councillors continue to review all planning matters judging all applications on their merit and working with the village councils in reviewing applications. However, there are still a high number of significant developments in the ward, which in ward councillors' views should be opposed. The application to put houses on Humberston Golf course is an example. The sad fact, however, is that if the proposed development complies with planning regulations and highway and environment do not object, it will be difficult for our opposition to succeed. This is due to the exceptionally high target the Labour government has imposed, over 650 homes per annum, which has never been achieved. As we cannot demonstrate a five-year supply at these levels, developers are holding the whip hand. Village councils should consider this carefully and perhaps try to maximise the section 106 funding available for the benefit of our villages.

Traffic Regulation and Enforcement

Discussions on Traffic Regulation Orders are ongoing, with several streets in the ward identified for future exclusion. It is also important to note that your Conservative administration has extended powers to tackle littering, dog fouling, and anti-social behaviour. Offenders now face immediate fines of £100, with enforcement teams operating borough wide. This action, which many residents see as overdue, will help foster pride in our ward.

As word councillors we are working hard to find mitigation for those roads around schools which are still blighted by inconsiderate parental parking around school times. The creation of School Streets has been attempted, but there is not enough support from residents to provide marshals for this to succeed at present. Alternatives are being pursued but these will not be as effective and will still take a frustratingly long time. Enforcement by CCTV is also being considered.

Community Engagement and Events

At the time of writing these notes, the village days in our two villages have not take place, we are sure that these will be successful and we thank all those participating in their success.

Welcome to the New Village Chairs

We are pleased to welcome Cllrs Elizabeth Shawhulme and Cllr Stephanie Smith as the Chairs of the Village Councils for Humberston and New Waltham respectively. We wish them well in their efforts in the new municipal year.

Reflecting on Recent Local Elections

Ward councillors' notes are not intended to be political; however, it would be remiss not to acknowledge the significant result of the recent May local elections in North East Lincolnshire. Reform virtually swept the board across the borough, and Residents of Humberston and New Waltham turned out in large numbers to echo this trend. There is no doubt that voting patterns focussed on the national mood of dissatisfaction with both Labour and Conservatives, but the election was not a general election but voting for your local authority. I'm afraid local issues were swept away by the national mood. The direct consequence of this was that our ward lost one of its hardest working councillors, Cllr Steve Harness, who has helped numerous residents on a wide range of issues, way beyond that which could be reasonably expected. It's a great shame that residents could not reflect his loyalty and hard work when they voted. I offer Steve our thanks and best wishes for the future. Sad indeed, but that's politics I guess. The result for our ward is that you now have a new Reform councillor Simon Taylor.

Roads, Gullies, and Ward Appearance

You will all no doubt agree that in general terms our roads verges and gullies are looking the best that they have for a long time, this is a direct result of the additional resources that the Conservative administration has provided. There are exceptions of course, including the recent resurfacing where that stone finish was nor properly sealed. This has affected a number of roads in the ward, but the contractor will be returning and rectifying this at their own expense.

Pothole Repairs

Potholes are a national problem this year and our ward is no exception. That said, your Conservative administration has deployed significant additional funding and resources, including a number of additional crews and the back log is being addressed as conditions allow. Residents are reminded that the response to pothole reports has been generally very good and this continues.

Humberston & New Waltham Ward Update April 2026

Crime Headlines:

There were forty-eight reported crimes across the Humberston & New Waltham Wards for March 2026 although much of this has been in Humberston this month which has resulted in additional patrols from your local team and other resources in the affected areas.

On 2nd March 2026, damage was caused to a caravan at a local caravan park in HUMBERSTON by a suspect who caused damage to the furniture.

On 13th March 2026, there was a public order incident at a retail premises on HEWITTS CIRCUS, CLEETHORPES in which the suspect was verbally abusive towards staff before leaving the store.

On 21st March 2026, there was an incident of affray on EAGLE DRIVE, HUMBERSTON. Armed police attended and a male was arrested for this matter. Updated- The suspect has since been charged with the offence.

Our priorities moving forward in May/June 2026 period will be focusing on Anti-Social Behaviour and Community related issues.

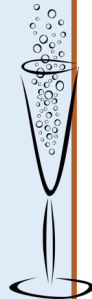

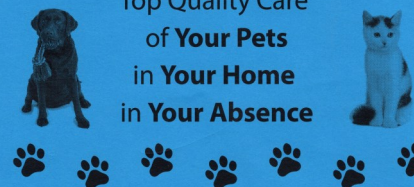

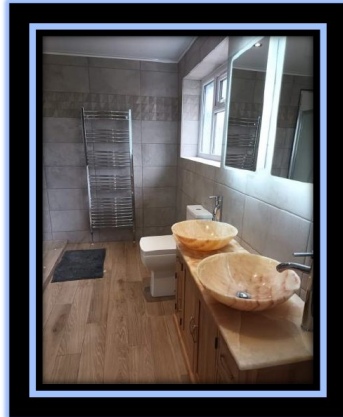
